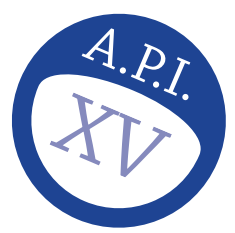

Second Call for Papers

Although the focus of the conference is on Italian literature in general, papers in other literary traditions are also invited.
